# REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING PIKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Pike County Board of Commissioners held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, January 11, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in the Courthouse, Main Courtroom, at 16001 Barnesville Street, Zebulon. Chairman Briar Johnson convened the meeting and Commissioners Tim Daniel, Tim Guy, Jason Proctor and James Jenkins attended. County Manager Brandon Rogers, County Attorney Rob Morton and County Clerk Angela Blount were also present. (O.C.G.A. § 50-14-1(e) (2)).

#### c. County Manager Comment

County Manager Brandon Rogers updated the Board on the Opioid settlement. Pike County has received two deposits, one for \$8,245.93 and one for \$22,388.94 totaling \$30,634.87. The funds can only be on evidence-based programs and things of that nature. Discussed training First Responders on NARCAN and providing them with NARCAN. A new checking account has been set up with United Bank for these funds.

The 4-H shotgun team, also known as Project SAVE, and the archery team are having problems finding places to hold their practices. The possibility of using the Pike County Landfill for a practice area is an option. Last year, the 4-H shotgun team was traveling to Gay for weekly practices. The archery team has worked out something with Life Springs Church and is able to practice locally. CM Rogers stated he, Todd Goolsby Director of Public Works, and Brooklyne Wassel the 4-H Director met at the landfill and viewed some areas that the shotgun team could hold practices. There is plenty of land behind the landfill. A permanent practice facility would allow for the Pike County Extension office to meet the needs of Pike County and plan for future growth of not only SAFE sports but Pike County 4-H. The county can put an entrance in that comes out beside the transfer station. Shotgun team Coach Steve Fry and 4-H Director Brooklyne Wassel are both present if the Board would like to ask any questions. There were concerns with the location being close to the shooting range of the Sheriff's office. CM Rogers stated he did coordinate with the Sheriff's office, and they do not see any conflicts. The Sheriff's training is during the week while kids are in school, and the shotgun team practice is usually late afternoons or weekends. The shotgun team will provide a practice schedule to the Sheriff's Department and if there was ever a conflict the Sheriff's office would contact the county and the conflict would be

worked out between the two. CM Rogers noted that everything that the 4-H is planning on putting up is completely mobile. It can be put up in one day and taken down in one day. The monitoring company of the landfill has been contacted and there are no issues with using the land at the landfill. The Pike County Extension office provided a letter of support for the Board to consider this location for the shotgun team to hold practices. Commissioner Daniel stated he has always thought that property needed to be utilized and he does not see an issue with it. Commissioner Proctor asked if Chestnut Oak was an option. CM Rogers replied that there are concerns with Chestnut Oak with the new facility going in and the arena that there is not enough space. Chairman Johnson asked about using the Sheriff's office practice range, but it is a little small. CM Rogers stated there are additional SAFE sports that they would like to expand to in the future. Commissioner Proctor asked how much work was going to be required to get it prepared for a practice field. CM Rogers replied that the landfill does have some soft spots which will require some gravel to be put down. The drive is long with some big dips in it and will need to be graveled and a culvert installed, which will be a total of about \$2,000 to get the landfill ready.

### Motion/second by Commissioners Daniel/Guy to allow 4-H project SAFE (Shooting Awareness, Fun and Education) Coach, Steve Fry, to speak, motion carried 5-0.

4-H shotgun team Head Coach, Steve Fry, addressed the Board stating the problem with Chestnut Oak is Saturdays are usually when the shotgun team practices which is the same time when Chestnut Oak holds events with livestock and shooting does not go well with animals. Mr. Fry noted the shotgun team will be launching clay targets that are biodegradable. Steve Fry stated shooting sports are in our heritage, it is part of what makes us who we are. Self-sufficient, able to put food on the table if need be; being able to protect our loved ones, ourselves. Beyond that, it is a pastime, a competitive sport, recreation, with variables and inherent challenges you will not find in computer games and videos. If a teacher posted a class labeled physics, discipline, focus, responsibility, coping, competency, concentration, and mathematics, who would sign up? Shooting sports teach discipline, responsibility to self and others, self-control, mental focus, patience, and give direct feedback, measurable goals, and  $skills \ progress. \ There \ are \ SMART \ goals: \ \textbf{Specific/Measurable/Attainable/Relevant/Time-based}.$ Seeing the kids shoot a personal best, watching them qualify for State or National competitions, seeing shooters compensate for wind, temperature, and target presentations, keep focus and concentration and break clay targets is very rewarding. It gives a higher level of confidence in the future of our upcoming generations. The interest in shooting sports is on the rise. Thirty-eight shotgun coaches were certified this past weekend at the Rock Eagle 4-H facility with two being from Pike County. Over the past few years, it has been difficult to find suitable range space for Pike County 4-H'ers. A field was used at a Pike County farm for a while, but a change of ownership and development caused them to look elsewhere. A deal was worked out with folks at BROP in Gay which allowed them use of a field just beyond their sporting clay course, but the price made it difficult to keep registration fees low for the youth. The realization of having a dedicated space, in Pike County, is beneficial, and so helpful in the ability to continue the program and expand reach to give this great opportunity to Pike County youth. The 4-H shooting sports program is backed, and provided oversight by, the University of Georgia Extension and the 4-H National Shooting Sports program. Insurance and legal assistance are provided by the University of Georgia. "Go Dawgs" All 4-H youth competitors are required to complete the Georgia DNR certified Hunter Safety Education Course. All Coaches must be certified by 4-H National Shooting Sports accredited instructors and pass background checks and complete training regarding working with youth. 4-H started in 1902, 121 years ago, and it is because of the partnership between the County governments and the National and State organizations that youth and future leaders continue to be served. Mr. Fry thanked the Board for the opportunity to work with them to research this worthwhile endeavor and find a way to bring this dream to reality for Pike County youth and their

## Motion/second by Commissioners Guy/Daniel to approve 4-H project SAFE to use the landfill property for a practice location, motion carried 5-0.

**For Discussion:** Commissioner Daniel stated he was thinking about noise from the shotguns while soccer game/baseball game going on, about it being a good way from the fields. CM Rogers stated it is a good way from the fields and they will be facing the opposite direction. The land is flat when you enter it, then you go down a hill and over another hill and the practice area will be on the back side of the hill. The sound will probably be heard but not overbearing. Commissioner Jenkins stated for a side note that his son participates on the shotgun team, and they have been to Gay and shot clay targets and deer walk by while shooting the clay targets and are never scared.

Commissioner Daniel is currently serving on the Three Rivers Regional Commission Board and due to some conflicts, unable to attend the meetings. According to the By-Laws of the Three Rivers Regional Commission Board, the chief elected official of each county governing body for a period concurrent with such elected official's term of elected office; however, if the chief elected official is unable to serve, he or she shall appoint another elected official of the county governing body for such official's term of elected office. The Board has six meetings a year at Turin Town Hall in Turin, GA and the next scheduled meeting is February 23, 2023, at 1:00 p.m. Chairman Briar Johnson agreed to serve on the Three Rivers Regional Commission Board.

Chairman Briar Johnson stated Pike County has been working with the municipalities on the Service Delivery Strategy. The County Mananger has been in discussions with the City of Zebulon and the City of Molena in reference to helping pay some costs to E-911 and Impact Fee Collections. The letters are just an invitation to open conversations between the county and the municipalities.

Motion/second by Commissioners Daniel/Proctor to approve Chairman Briar Johnson to sign the letters and send to the cities in reference to E-911 Shared Expenses and Impact Fee Collection, motion carried 5-0.

The county has received the ISO report and the ISO rating stayed the same. A very detailed report was provided to the county that has information the county can continue to work on. The county is looking to lower the ISO rating soon. Pike County can call ISO at anytime to reevaluate the county once the county is ready.

#### d. Commissioner Reports

District 1 – Commissioner Daniel – No report

District 2 – Commissioner Guy – No report

District 3 – Commissioner Proctor – No report

District 4 – Commissioner Jenkins received a phone call last week from a citizen who has a business in the county for 50 plus years. The gentleman stated he has to make two trips to get a business license now when he did not have to do this in prior years. County Mananger Brandon Rogers noted in the last two years the county has tried to progress in the business license category. Planning and Development Director, Jeremy Gilbert, addressed the Board stating business license purchase/renewals is a part of the new iWorks system. The business owner is required to fill out two affidavits, citizenship affidavit and e-verify affidavit. If the business owner does not upload the affidavits online, they must physically take the affidavits to the Planning and Development office. Sometimes it does take the applicant two trips, but the department is working on the ability to be able to send the invoice to the applicant and the applicant pays it online and a business license is issued and emailed to them. The process is being worked on to make it easier.

At Large Chairman Briar Johnson noted the Agribusiness Authority Board has one vacancy if anyone is interested serving on that Board and the J. Joel Edwards Library Board has one vacancy if anyone is interested.

Thanked the Pike County Fire Department, Fire Chief, and all involved for helping man a fire station when severe weather threatens the county.

#### e. County Attorney Report to Commissioners

County Attorney Rob Morton addressed the Board stating his office has been busy with some contracts that were provided for review including creating an opinion of the counsel at the request of the County Mananger also addressing the Constitutional Officers certain contracts.

Assisted with open records request with the county as well as with the Constitutional Officers.

Dealing with some land use questions and addressing issues related to the moratorium.

The office continues to prosecute county ordinance violations. There are arraignment calendars and trial calendars every month.

At the request by the County Mananger, to provide post-closing documentation to closings on behalf of the Development Authority.

County Attorney Rob Morton noted he was invited by the County Mananger in assisting with some of the Service Delivery Strategy meetings with the municipalities and anticipate there are going to be intergovernmental agreements, either modifying or creating new ones.

a. Elect Vice Chairman for the Pike County Board of Commissioners for 2023.

Motion/second by Commissioners Proctor/Guy to elect Tim Daniel as Vice Chairman for the Pike County Board of Commissioners for year 2023, motion carried 4-1, with Commissioner Daniel abstaining.

b. Second Reading of Text Amendment the Pike County Code of Ordinances Title III: Administration, Chapter 35 County Policies, Section 35.09 Financial Policies.

County Attorney Rob Morton stated that the Board had asked pursuant to a motion a text amendment to financial policies. No final action was taken so it is back on the agenda for a second reading.

Motion/second by Commissioners Jenkins/Proctor to approve second reading, motion carried 4-1, with Commissioner Daniel opposing.

#### c. Discussion of Impact Fees.

County Mananger Brandon Rogers stated Jeremy Gilbert, Planning and Development Director found out some information from Paragon last week. When the previous Planning and Development Director was with the County sometime between 2018 and 2020, Paragon did more leg work on the Impact Fees than what they were aware of. Paragon did a good bit of work on the current departments and the methodology reports for each one based on projects between 2018 and 2025. Paragon came up with the amount of funding needed by 2025, the Impact Fees would need to be raised in Pike County to \$6,776.62 per dwelling. The current Impact Fee is \$2404.15 that was set in 2006 and has not changed since then. When Paragon took the information five years ago with the projects then, they came up with an Impact Fee of \$6,776.62 that should be collected. The percentage of allocations for each

department will need to be reconsidered. The County Manager provided his recommendation. The current balances have been provided as well. See charts below.

A workshop has been discussed between Pike County Board of Commissioners and the Pike County Planning and Zoning Board to discuss Impact Fees. Tentatively the date for the workshop will be Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. As soon as a date is confirmed, an agenda will be sent out.

Chairman Briar Johnson asked if Impact Fees has a certain time limit that they must be spent. CM Rogers replied yes, he believes it is six years. Commissioner Proctor suggested that the surrounding counties need to be called and see what they charge for Impact Fees and a breakdown of costs needs to be looked at for each department. A lot of information needs to be obtained. CM Rogers reminded the Board that this is just the Residential Impact Fees and Commercial Impact Fees would have to be looked at as well. Commissioner Daniel noted that is a substantial difference in the Impact Fees from what is being proposed to what is being collected now.

#### Discussion only, no motion entertained.

d. Discussion of County Contracts.

County Mananger Brandon Rogers stated several contracts are coming up for renewal within the next couple of months. There are nine contracts coming up for renewal. Driver Adams CPA contract is expiring. The Board needs to decide if they want to do RFPs for audit services or continue to use Driver Adams CPA for auditors. Ameripro is an automatic renewal unless the Board decides they want to change some things. CM Rogers is requesting feedback from the Board on the nine contracts and how the Board would like to proceed. Commissioner Proctor stated he would like RFPs sent out for Amwaste, Flint River Tree and Landscaping and Wired Technology. CM Rogers stated RFPs will be prepared and sent out on Flint River Tree and Landscaping and Wired Technology. Flint River Tree and Landscaping requires a 60-day notification of termination and their contract is up June 30, 2023. Wired Technology does not have an existing contract they have continued to work from the OTG contract when Britain Turner had it. CM Rogers noted Amwaste has an auto renewal and requires a 90-day notification of termination. When the contract was signed in June with Amwaste, the termination date was December 31. CM Rogers stated there needs to be conversation between Amwaste and their contract needs to be updated. Chairman Briar Johnson asked if the pest control needs to be looked at since the county has more than one pest control company to make sure the county is getting the best service for the price. CM Rogers replied that the contract with Pike Pest Control was drawn up years ago and they have never changed their fees. Pike Pest Control provides excellent service to the county. Chairman Briar Johnson said never mind what he said on Pike Pest Control. Commissioner Tim Daniel stated he would like to see a renewal worked out with Driver Adams CPA.

Motion/second by Commissioners Proctor/Daniel to send out for RFPs for Amwaste, Flint River Tree and Landscaping and Wired Technology and renew contracts with Amerirpo, Driver Adams CPA, Morton/Morton, Nextiva, Pike Family Connection and Pike Pest Control, motion carried 5-0.

e. Discussion of Service Delivery Strategy.

County Mananger Brandon Rogers addressed the Board stating he has met with all the municipalities regarding the Service Delivery Strategy. County Attorney Rob Morton attended most of those meetings. CM Rogers updated the Board stating as of now, City of Zebulon and City of Molena wanted to discuss the E-911 in further detail and the City of Zebulon also wanted to talk about Impact Fees. The City of Zebulon has requested that the county enter into a Service Delivery agreement for street storm water and drainage. The City of Zebulon is looking to apply for additional grants and their grant writer advised having an agreement with county will be substantial. CM Rogers noted he has encouraged all the other municipalities to join in as well. County Mananger Rogers stated all the Commissioners should have received an email with the Service Delivery Strategy Tracker for them to review and suggest any changes, the street storm water and drainage for City of Zebulon has not been added to the tracker yet but will be if the Board agrees to. Commissioner Proctor stated he was good with what the County Mananger has. CM Rogers stated if the Board is good with it all, he and the County Attorney will collect all the information and start preparing Intergovernmental Agreements to have ready at the next Board of Commissioners meeting or the first meeting in February. February 28, 2023 is the deadline.

#### Discussion only, no motion entertained.

f. Approve/deny sell of (3) vehicles as surplus on GovDeals – 2006 F150 Truck, 2011 Ford Taurus, 2001 Crown Victoria.

County Manager Brandon Rogers stated all three vehicles have been turned in to Public Works. Two of the vehicles, 2011 Ford Taurus and 2001 Crown Victoria came from the Sheriff's Office and has reached their end of life. The 2006 F-150 Truck has a blown engine.

Motion/second by Commissioners Guy/Proctor to approve selling 2006 F-150 Truck, 2011 Ford Taurus, and 2001 Crown Victoria as surplus on GovDeals, motion carried 5-0.

g. Approve/deny SUB-18-05 – STS Development, LLC, owner and applicant are requesting final plat approval for a 29-lot major subdivision (Whitehorse Subdivision Phase II). The Property Location: Beeks Road., Williamson, GA. 30292. Land Lots: 198, 199, 218 & 219. Land District: 1st. Parcel ID: 039 046. Acreage: 100.21 acres. Commission District: 1 Commissioner: Tim Daniel. FEMA Data: Does not lie within a flood zone.

Planning and Development Director, Jeremy Gilbert, addressed the Board stating the request before them is the final plat approval of the second phase of Whitehorse subdivision. The second phase will have 29 lots. The preliminary plat was approved by the Board of Commissioners on June 29, 2018, and the development plans for phase two were approved by staff on February 10, 2022. All work has been completed and approved by Public Works and is ready for final plat approval. Each lot will be serviced by private septic and well systems. Pike County Water and Sewer Authority confirms no access to public utilities. Pike County Health Department will permit each system individually as the lots apply for permits. R-20, Single Family Residential 2,000 square feet minimum zoning remain. Under current

code, houses will have to be 2,000 square feet or more of heated space. The name of the subdivision will be "Whitehorse Phase 2". This name does not conflict with any other named subdivision in Pike County. This request was heard by the Planning and Zoning Board on December 8, 2022, and the Planning and Zoning Board along with Staff recommends approval of final plat. Commissioner Daniel noted he was very pleased with Phase 1 of Whitehorse Subdivision and would not think any different of Phase 2.

### Motion/second by Commissioners Daniel/Guy to approve SUB-18-05 final plat, motion carried 5-0.

h. Approve/deny SUB-22-09 – Karen L. Strelecki, owner and Steve Reeves agent are requesting a 9-lot major subdivision (Shade Tree Field). The applicant is requesting concurrent preliminary and final plat approval. Property Location: No Address Assigned. 5795 Highway 362, Williamson, GA. 30292. Land Lots: 183 & 184. Land District: 1st. Parcel ID: 025 021 & 038 002M. Acreage: 146.25 acres. Commission District: 4 Commissioner: James Jenkins FEMA Data: Does not lie within a flood zone.

# Note: Documentation provided to the Board of Commissioners office by the Planning and Development office has Commissioner James Jenkins as Commissioner and it is District 1, Commissioner Tim Daniel.

Planning and Development Director, Jeremy Gilbert, addressed the Board stating the request before them a 9-lot major subdivision with an existing runway and no new infrastructure being proposed. The existing runway is a FAA numbered runway. The subject property is currently zoned A-R, Agricultural-Residential. Each proposed lot will be equal to or larger than the required 2-acre minimum with the smallest proposed lot being 10.7 acres and the largest proposed lot being 23.66 acres. The subject property received a variance from the Board of Appeals on June 16, 2022 to allow flag lots to be closer than 400 feet apart. The variance was approved with the following two conditions: 1) Preliminary and Final Plat approval will be required before the lot can be subdivided and the proposed subdivision can be created, 2) Lots 6,7 and 9 shall use a shared drive and access easement agreement shall be required at final plat. Each lot will be serviced by private septic and well systems. Pike County Water and Sewer Authority confirms no access to public utilizes. Pike County Health Department will permit each system individually as the lots apply for permits. A-R zoning will remain. Under current code, houses will have to be 1500 square feet or more of heated space. The name of the subdivision shall be "Shade Tree Field". This name does not conflict with any other named subdivision in Pike County. The Planning and Zoning Board heard this request on December 8, 2022 and recommended denial of this request. Staff recommends concurrent approval of preliminary and final plats with the following condition: 1) The two variance conditions shall be printed on the final plat before recording. The final plat being submitted today has the subdivision divided into two phases. The applicant is only requesting approval of the first 6 lots, Phase 1. Phase 2 will be presented to the Board for approval at a later date. The preliminary plat is approval of all 9 lots and the final plat is just for Phase 1. Commissioner Daniel asked Jeremy Gilbert why the Planning and Zoning Board denied the request. Jeremy Gilbert replied during the meeting the discussion came up about the airfield and the school regarding the location of the airfield and how it will impact the school. Commissioner Daniel noted the Board is not voting on an airport because it is already an existing runway. The Board is only voting on the subdivision. A citizen addressed an issue during Town Hall about limiting the number of airplanes flying in and out, Jeremy Gilbert stated from a county standpoint that would be very difficult. The applicant has put together an extensive set of covenants and restrictions that does limit the hours the runway can be utilized and who can utilize the runway, the owners and their guests. Commissioner Daniel noted wind determines the direction of take-off and landing. Jeremy Gilbert noted the runway sits at an angle and the flight pattern would be south of the school. The runway was opened in 1971 and the school opened in 1994. Commissioner Jenkins has requested Steve Fry speak since he is a pilot and has interest in the school.

### Motion/second by Commissioners Jenkins/Proctor to allow Steve Fry to speak, motion carried 5-0.

Steve Fry addressed the Board stating he has several years of experience as a pilot and has three kids that attend Crosspointe Christian Academy. Mr. Fry asked if anyone knew when the last aviation activity took place on the existing runway. No one knew the last aviation activity. Traffic control restrictions can be put in place if that would help appease the situation. Looking at the arial of the existing airfield, will the runway maintain the same orientation as it is in the overhead view. If it is staying the same, the take-off and landing does not go over the school, it goes over Mr. Bert Willis' property. Mr. Fry asked if there were any visions for vegetation sound buffers that may help eliminate the sound of aircraft preparing for take-off.

Steve Reeves, the applicant, addressed the Board stating the airstrip was installed in 1971. If the school is concerned with the runway, did they look at doing a study before building the school. Two houses are already on the property and one of the houses will be combined with another lot of the subdivision so it is only an additional seven new homes. The airstrip does not go over the school, it barely goes over a corner piece of the property where trees are. As far as the noise, the planes that will be using the air strip, the majority are the lowest class of airplanes and lowest class of sound. The runway is only 2400 feet long. The school puts out more noise from the kids playing, football games and band than the airplanes do. There are several subdivisions built around airstrips in Pike County. The public school just purchased a \$1.4 million dollar property to build new schools on and there is an airstrip behind the property on Green Street that points directly over the property. If there was an issue with the airstrip, it would have been brought up before the school spent \$1.4 million dollars.

Commissioner Jenkins stated his kids attended Crosspointe Christian School and he spent a lot of time at the school and never saw an airplane out there.

Motion/second by Commissioners Daniel/Guy to approve Phase I (6 lots) with two conditions, motion carried 3-2, with Commissioner Proctor and Commissioner Jenkins opposing. Conditions are as follows:

- Preliminary and final plat approval will be required before the lot can be subdivided and the proposed subdivision can be created.
- Lots 6, 7 and 9 shall use a shared drive and an access easement agreement shall be required at final plat.
- Discussion of Pike County Board of Education Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant Application.

County Mananger Brandon Rogers stated the Board of Education has been discussing with Department of Transportation about upgrading some projects, a couple of entrances and exits at the schools. The Board of Education is asking the Board of Commissioners to support them and request on their behalf LMIG funding. This will not have any effect on the county LMIG.

Motion/second by Commissioners Proctor/Daniel to approve submitting an application for LMIG on behalf of the Board of Education, motion carried 5-0.

County Attorney Rob Morton asked the Board to consider adding to the agenda under New Business, Item b. ratifying the Declaration of Local Emergency that was executed earlier in the day.

#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

a. Discussion of Emergency Management funding regarding severe weather on January 12, 2023.

County Mananger Brandon Rogers addressed the Board stating all the roads are opened back up and are passable. The next stage is debris clean up and that can be costly. Some of the locals are going to allow the county to do some of the dumping of debris on their property, the county will get in touch with EPD to get approval. Commissioner Proctor noted he has property on Bethany Church Road that the county can dump debris on. If EPD approves the dumping, it will save the county time and money. Commissioner Daniel asked if there is a possibility of the county getting some aid or reimbursement. County Mananger Rogers stated the reimbursement is hopeful but not a guarantee. As of today, the damage in Pike County has not been declared a tornado yet. County Manager Brandon Rogers noted most of the funding expenses will be payroll and debris clean up and asked the Board to loosen some constraints on this emergency in relation to payroll and debris clean up. Commissioner Jenkins asked if the county receives any reimbursement, will it replenish the funds spent in this emergency. CM Rogers replied yes, all funding comes out of general fund directly and any reimbursement will be put back into general funds. EMA Director, Jim Totten, stressed to the Board that the reimbursement can happen, but it is not easy. Mr. Totten mentioned that Pike County was one of the last counties to declare an emergency because the declaration was just signed. The four surrounding counties have already declared a local emergency. The reimbursement is federal level. GEMA does not provide funds; it is all FEMA. Commissioner Proctor asked if it would help if the county got Drew Ferguson involved. Mr. Totten replied to it can but first the county has to do damage assessments to see if the county qualifies for financial aid from FEMA. County Manager Brandon Rogers stated typically he would have an estimate to provide but he does not know what the cost would be in this case. Commissioner Proctor asked what happens if the county does not get reimbursed. CM Rogers replied that the county will have to eat the expenses. The EMA Director, Jim Totten, stated citizens will start calling wanting debris removed on their property to keep in mind the county clears the roadways and right of ways.

Motion/second by Commissioners Jenkins/Proctor to approve the additional funding related to the severe storm and related damage including but not limited to payroll, debris removal and whatever else is necessary, motion carried 3-0.

# WORKSHOP PIKE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Pike County Board of Commissioners held a workshop on Tuesday, January 17, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. in the Courthouse, Courtroom 2, at 16001 Barnesville Street, Zebulon. Chairman Briar Johnson convened the meeting and Commissioners Tim Daniel, Jason Proctor and James Jenkins attended. County Manager Brandon Rogers, County Attorney Rob Morton and County Clerk Angela Blount were also present. (O.C.G.A. § 50-14-1(e) (2)). Commissioner Tim Guy arrived at 4:05 p.m.

- 5. NEW BUSINESS
  - a. Review and Discussion of Ordinances related to Building and Zoning.

The Pike County Board of Commissioners and the Pike County Zoning Board had a joint meeting to discuss ordinances related to Building and Zoning. Pike County Zoning Board members in attendance were Jason Leatherman, Scott Huckaby, Ed Penland, Brandy Loggins and Bryan Pate. Planning and Development Director, Jeremy Gilbert, was also in attendance.

Motion/second by Commissioners Proctor/Daniel to allow The Walkers to speak regarding their property located at 569 Pitts Road, motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Walker addressed both Boards stating that they purchased property at 569 Pitts Road several years ago that consists of around 73 acres with 30 feet of road frontage, a flag lot. Mr. Walker noted the way the ordinance is written now he does not have enough road frontage to split the property and give his grandson three acres of land to build a house. Zoning requires more than 30 feet of road frontage now. When the property was purchased years ago, 30 feet of road frontage was not required and now the code requires a minimum of 60 feet of road frontage. The only option is for the homeowner to ask for a variance to the road frontage.

Impact Fees are being re-evaluated. Paragon provided the county with some information they had prepared around the years 2019/2020 from the methodology report. The methodology report is the way Paragon comes up with the Impact Fees figures. Paragon recommended Pike County Impact Fees amount be \$6,775.99 (includes administration fees and CIE prep fees) from year 2019 to year 2025. In the year 2025, the county is supposed to do a new evaluation. There are currently seven categories that the Impact Fees are allocated into: Library, Fire, Sheriff, Detention Facilities, 911, Parks and Recreation and Roads. There is a time limit constraint of when the Impact Fees must be used by. CM Rogers stated it will take about a year for a methodology study to be completed and it is not cheap, somewhere between \$50,000 - \$80,000. Impact Fees will be discussed at the next Board of Commissioners meeting. If the Impact Fees are changed, the reallocations of the fees need to be discussed as well. The water department is not a category on the Impact Fee and was asked if it can be added. County Manager Brandon Rogers replied that it can be added but it is better for the water department to collect tap fees and not collect Impact Fees. The water department collects capital recovery fees which is like the county collecting Impact Fees.

Livestock in A-R – Sections 156.43 (A)(1) and 156.43 (D)(3). The code now reads agriculture, including the keeping of livestock, on tracts of land not less than 2 acres, and not within platted residential subdivisions (named neighborhoods). Livestock on qualified tracts shall be kept at the maximum rate of one per acre. Swine are restricted. The way the code is written today, if a citizen owns 100 acres they must come before the Board to get a special exception to allow for cows if their house is on the same property as what the cows are. If the house is platted out on a separate piece of property, then a special exception would not be needed to have cows on the vacant land. A house cannot be associated in A-R when keeping livestock without getting a special exception. One potential option would be taking the Residential out of A-R and modify the code. County Attorney Rob Morton noted that a special exception is now being defined as a variance which is something the Planning and Zoning Board can handle without going before the Board of Commissioners. Something to consider is allowing the Planning and Zoning Board to be the final approval on all special exceptions and not requiring them to go to the Board of Commissioners for approval.

Both Boards discussed the following topics in the Pike County Code that needs clarification or amended. Guest quarters size in the A-R Zoning District continues to come up over and over so why not change the ordinance. New zoning districts need to be created for residential districts to allow different lot sizes and lot dimensions and take away the Agricultural uses in the Residential districts. A-R zoning needs to be looked at to change the minimum lot size for subdivisions. A land lot size needs to be looked at that will be appropriate for agricultural use. The ordinance now has all the R Districts same lot size just different size square foot minimum for house. Adding building material requirements for residential zoning districts. Setbacks need to be looked at. The front yard setbacks should be from the property line and not from the centerline of the road. Look at changing the number of lot splits for a minor subdivision from 4 lots to 5 lots every 5 years. Section 156.28

of the Pike County Code needs to be changed to meet state code regarding the posting of signs on properties, as well as the time to re-apply for rezonings after a denial needs to be changed from one year to six months. The location of meetings for amendments needs to be updated, the code currently states meetings will take place at the County Courthouse Annex at 79 Jackson Street, Zebulon GA and should read Pike County Courthouse, Main Courtroom, 16001 Barnesville Street Zebulon, GA. The administrative variance section in the code needs to be cleaned up, it currently references old sections that do not exist. The requirement for an accessory building before a primary building requirement needs to be looked at. The code currently reads you must have 10 acres or more to have an accessory building before a primary building. Flag lots need to be looked at to determine if changes need to be made to them, as in paving driveways on flag lots for public safety access. The Planning and Development Director, Jeremy Gilbert, will be looking at preparing something to take to the Board of Commissioners to review. Discussed if the county should look at creating a unified development code or just update the code currently in place. A unified development code has all the information listed under one section. The Board of Commissioners and the Planning and Zoning Board both agreed to creating a unified development code.

### Motion/second by Commissioners Proctor/Daniel to allow public input during workshop, motion carried 5-0.

Pike County citizen, Steve Reeves, addressed the Boards stating a unified development code is a lot easier to work with because everything is one place. Mr. Reeves is not sure Pike County has enough development going on to change to a full-blown unified development code but if you wait until later, it will present more problems later. The Planning and Zoning Director, Jeremy Gilbert, stated he would rather start from scratch than try to fix what is in the ordinance book. A new land use map was adopted last year. Jeremy Gilbert stated it will take a minimum of six months to complete a unified development code. The Planning and Zoning Board will have workshops to compile information to create the code and then the Public Hearings will take place with the Board of Commissioners. The public will be invited to the workshops and the Public Hearings.

Mr. Steve Reeves addressed the Boards asking them to consider the criteria's when creating the unified development code, they are not just changing it for developers but for everybody in the county.

# PIKE COUNTY BOARD APPOINTMENT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Pike County desires to encourage and facilitate public participation in local governance, including the various boards, authorities and commissions appointed by the Board of Commissioners. The policies and procedures set forth in this section are intended to ensure fairness, safety and uniformity in the appointments made by the Board of Commissioners.

- Pending board appointments shall be confirmed as to terms and expiration dates, publicly announced at Board of Commissioners meetings, posted in public commons areas of the Courthouse and Courthouse Annex, and advertised appropriately in the legal organ.
- Commissioners and County Manager will be notified of all board vacancies or ending of a term that will require Board of Commissioners to make an appointment. The Board shall make every effort to fill vacancies as expeditiously as possible. In the event of an expired term, members may continue to serve until a new member is appointed.
- Members of all Boards/Commissions/Authorities serve at the pleasure of the Pike County Board of Commissioners. Any person appointed by the Board of Commissioners may be removed with or without cause upon the majority vote of the Board of Commissioners.
- Board applications will be retained for a period not to exceed one year.
- All Board/Commissioners/Authorities must function in accordance with provisions of the Pike County Code of Ordinances and Georgia laws, as well as a financial disclosure for certain boards.
- New appointees shall be oriented regarding their appointment by the Chairperson, Director or other designated representative of the board, authority or commission related to their appointment.
- Applicants for appointments to boards, authorities or commissions shall be required to attend the meeting of the Board of Commissioners at which their application for appointment will be considered; except, however, incumbents seeking reappointment are invited but shall not be required to attend such meeting.
- While some boards may have additional requirements, and general and/or local law may supersede on specific issues, the following criteria shall otherwise apply to all appointments:
  - The appointee shall be a Pike County resident and registered voter.
  - The appointee or reappointee shall have completed a Board Appointment Application.
  - Each applicant shall undergo a criminal background/history. Your signature below indicates authorization for the County Manger/Clerk only to conduct such a confidential background check, which shall not be made a part of any public record.
  - All other information provided is subject to public disclosure under Georgia Open Records Act.
  - No applicant may serve on more than two boards, commissions or authorities at the same time, unless otherwise authorized by county ordinance or upon the approval by majority vote of the Board of Commissioners.
  - Appointee shall be expected to diligently attend his/her Board/Commission/Authority meetings and satisfactorily complete any required training pertinent to his/her board appointment.
  - The successful appointee shall represent Pike County with dignity, demonstrate ethical and professional behavior, show respect for others, devote sufficient time and preparation for meetings, and maintain appropriate confidentiality of any privileged information, abiding by Georgia's Open Meeting and Open Records Laws.

2022 ORDINANCE REGARDING EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF PIKE COUNTY, GEORGIA TO PROVIDE REGULATIONS REGARDING EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT IN PIKE COUNTY, GEORGIA; TO PROVIDE A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 39 OF TITLE III OF THE CODE OF PIKE COUNTY, GEORGIA; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO SET AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Pike County Board of Commissioners desires that the Code of Ordinances, Pike County, Georgia be amended by adding Section 39.03 entitled "2022 **EMERGENCY** MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE" to Chapter 39 entitled "EMERGENCY **MANAGEMENT** SERVICES" of Title Ш entitled "ADMINISTRATION"; and, to repeal conflicting ordinances and/or codes, to provide for severability, to fix an effective date, and for other lawful purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the Pike County Board of Commissioners is empowered by the Constitution of the State of Georgia, including but not limited to, those police powers intended to ensure the health, safety and welfare of the general public of Pike County, Georgia; as well as being further empowered by the laws of the State of Georgia to enact local legislation, resolutions and/or ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, Pike County, pursuant to O.C.G.A. §§ 38-3-27 through 38-3-28 and 38-3-54 through 38-3-56 is specifically authorized to provide emergency management within Pike County; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners believes that an ordinance should be adopted to protect the health, safety and welfare of persons and property during an emergency or disaster resulting from manmade or natural causes; and,

WHEREAS, the Georgia Emergency Management Agency is the state agency assigned the responsibility for the coordination of all organizations for emergency management activities within this state; and

WHEREAS, the Pike County Emergency Management Agency is an established emergency management agency to provide emergency management within Pike County, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, to insure an effective and coordinated response to disasters, the Pike County Board of Commissioners intend for coordinated emergency management activities and responses between participating agencies including but not limited the Georgia Emergency Management Agency, the Pike County Emergency Management Agency and other participating agencies such a local municipalities.

*NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY* the Board of Commissioners of Pike County that the Code of Pike County, Georgia shall be amended to include the new

section 39.03 entitled "2022 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDINANCE" as follows:

Sec. 1. Title.

This Ordinance shall be known as the "2022 Emergency Management Ordinance of Pike County, Georgia"

#### Sec. 2. Regulations continued in effect.

All ordinances, resolutions, motions and orders pertaining to civil defense, emergency management and disaster relief, which are not in conflict with this chapter, are continued in full force and effect. Any such ordinances, resolutions, motions and orders should already be codified and are on file in the office of the County Clerk.

#### Sec. 3. Emergency management and response powers.

- (a) Declaration of local emergency.
  - (1) Grant of authority. In the event of an actual or threatened occurrence of a disaster or emergency, which may result in the large-scale loss of life, injury, property damage or destruction or in the major disruption of routine community affairs, business or governmental operations in the county and which is of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant extraordinary assistance by federal, state and local departments and agencies to supplement the efforts of available public and private resources, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency may declare a local emergency for Pike County, Georgia. The form of the declaration shall be similar to that provided in subsection (b) of this Code section.
  - (2) Request for state assistance. Consistent with a declaration of local emergency, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency request the Governor to provide assistance, provided that the disaster or emergency is beyond the capacity of the county to meet adequately and state assistance is necessary to supplement local efforts to save lives and protect property, public health and safety, or to avert or lessen the threat of a disaster.
  - (3) Continuance. The declaration of local emergency shall continue until the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency finds that emergency conditions no longer exist, at which time, a document marking the

end of the state of emergency shall be filed with the County Clerk. No state of local emergency shall continue for longer than 30 days, unless renewed by the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency. The Board of Commissioner of Pike County may, by resolution and in accordance with state and local law, end a state of local emergency at any time.

- (4) *Effect of declaration of local emergency.* 
  - a. Activation of emergency operations plan. A declaration of emergency by the Governor or a declaration of local emergency by the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency shall automatically activate the local emergency operations plan and shall be authority for the deployment of personnel and use of any forces to which the plan applies and for use or distribution of any supplies, equipment, materials, and facilities assembled, stockpiled or arranged to be made available pursuant to the Georgia Emergency Management Act or any other laws applicable to emergencies or disasters.
    - 1. The County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, shall have the legal authority to exercise the powers and discharge the duties conferred by law, including the implementation of the local emergency operations plan, coordination of the emergency responses of public and private agencies and organizations, coordination of recovery efforts with county, state and federal officials, and inspection of emergency or disaster sites.
    - 2. In responding and conducting necessary and appropriate investigations, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, is/are authorized to enter at a reasonable time upon any land, public or private, for the purpose of investigating and inspecting sites where emergency management functions may be necessary.
    - 3. No person shall refuse entry or access to land to any authorized representative or agent of the County who requests entry for purposes of inspection, and who presents appropriate credentials. Nor shall any person obstruct, hamper or interfere with any such

representative while that individual is in the process of carrying out his or her official duties.

- b. *Emergency powers*. Following a declaration of emergency and during the continuance of such state of emergency, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency is authorized to implement local emergency measures to protect life and property or to bring the emergency situation under control. In exercising this authority, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency may cause to become effective any of the following sections of this chapter as appropriate: Section 6 (overcharging prohibited), Section 7 (registration of building and repair services, and Section 8 (closed or restricted areas and curfews). If any of these sections is included in a declaration of local emergency, the same shall be filed in the office of the County Clerk and shall be in effect until the declaration of local emergency has terminated.
- c. Authority to waive procedures and fees. Pursuant to a declaration of emergency, the County is authorized to cause to be effective any of the subsections of Section 5 of this chapter as appropriate. The implementation of such subsections shall be filed in the office of the County Clerk.
- d. Additional emergency powers. The County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency shall have and may exercise for such period as the declared emergency exists or continues, the following additional emergency powers:
  - 1. To direct and advise (if people do not want to evacuate, advise that there will be no rescue after a certain point)the evacuation of all or part of the population from any stricken or threatened area, for the preservation of life or other disaster mitigation, response or recovery;
  - 2. To provide routes, modes of transportation and destinations in connection with evacuation;
  - 3. To limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of explosives and flammable liquids limit to 50 gallons outside vehicle fuel tank.

- 4. To make provision for the availability and use of temporary emergency housing, emergency shelters and/or emergency medical shelters.
- 5. To transfer the direction, personnel or functions of any County departments and agencies or units thereof for the purpose of performing or facilitating emergency services;
- 6. To utilize all available resources of the County and subordinate agencies over which the county has budgetary control as reasonably necessary to cope with the emergency or disaster;
- 7. To utilize public property when necessary to cope with the emergency or disaster or when there is compelling necessity for the protection of lives, health and welfare; and/or the property of citizens;
- 8. To suspend any law, code provision or regulation prescribing the procedures for conduct of County business, or the orders, rules or regulations of any County agency, if strict compliance with any ordinance, resolution, order, rule or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency or disaster, provided that such suspension shall provide for the minimum deviation from the requirements under the circumstances and further provided that, when practicable, specialists shall be assigned to avoid adverse effects resulting from such suspension;
- 9. To provide welfare benefits to citizens upon execution of an intergovernmental agreement for grants to meet disaster-related necessary expenses or serious needs of individuals or families adversely affected by an emergency or disaster in cases where the individuals or families are unable to meet the expenses or needs from other means, provided that such grants are authorized only when matching state or federal funds are available for such purposes;
- 10. To perform and exercise such other functions, powers and duties as may be deemed necessary to promote and secure the safety and protection of the civilian population, including individuals with household pets and service animals prior to, during, and following a major disaster or emergency.
- (b) Form of declaration. Upon the declaration of local emergency, an official "Declaration of Local Emergency," shall be signed and filed in the office of the County Clerk and shall be communicated to the citizens of the affected area using the most effective and efficient means available. The declaration shall state the nature of the emergency or disaster, the conditions that require the declaration and any sections of this chapter which shall be in effect. The form of the declaration shall be in substantially the same form as follows:

#### DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Pike County, Georgia has experienced an event of critical significance as a result of [DESCRIPTION OF EVENT] on [DATE]; and WHEREAS, in the judgment of the County Manager of Pike, there exist emergency circumstances located in [DESCRIBE GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION] requiring extraordinary and immediate corrective actions for the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Pike County, including individuals with household pets and service animals; and WHEREAS, to prevent or minimize injury to people and damage to property resulting from this event;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me by local and state law; IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that a local state of emergency exists and shall continue until the conditions requiring this declaration are abated.

#### WHEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) That the local emergency operations plan is hereby activated;
- (2) That the following shall be implemented: [If deemed appropriate, choose from the following: Section 6, Overcharging; Section 7, Registration of Building and Repair Services; Section 8, Closed or Restricted Areas and Curfews]; and
- (3) That the following measures also be implemented: [If deemed appropriate, select items from Section 3(a)(4)c, d or any other measure(s) deemed appropriate.]

ENTERED at [TIME] on [DATE].

(c) *Contracts with local governments*. In addition to the normal agreements embodied in the local emergency operations plan for mutual emergency assistance, the County may contract with any municipality or county for the administration of a local emergency response program.

#### Sec. 4. Enforcement and remedies.

- (a) Law enforcement. In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 38-3-4, the Pike County Sheriff's Office shall be authorized to enforce the orders, rules and regulations contained in this Ordinance and/or implemented by the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, or by any other participating municipalities within their jurisdiction.
- (b) *Penalties*. Failure to comply with any of the requirements or provisions of the regulations contained in this Ordinance, or with any applicable state or local statute, order, rule or regulation made effective as authorized herein upon or after the declaration of an emergency shall constitute a violation of the provisions of this ordinance. Any person who violates any provision in this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00, imprisonment for a term not exceeding 120

days, or both such fine and imprisonment, for each violation. Each person assisting in the commission of a violation, shall be guilty of separate offenses. Each day during which a violation or failure to comply continues shall constitute a separate violation.

- (c) *Injunctive relief.* In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 38-3-5, in addition to the remedies prescribed in this section, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency is/are authorized to obtain an injunction to restrain violation of laws, code sections, orders, rules and regulations which are contained in the Georgia Emergency Management Act and/or this Ordinance, and/or which are implemented by the County during a declared emergency.
- (d) *Enforcement*. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, this ordinance may be enforced by the Pike County Sheriff's Office or any city law enforcement office within a city (Zebulon and Molena)

#### Sec. 5. Authority to waive procedures and fee structures.

- (a) County business. Upon declaration of an emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the affairs and business of Pike County may be conducted at places other than the regular or usual location, within or outside of the county, when it is not prudent, expedient or possible to conduct business at the regular location. When such meetings occur outside of the county, all actions taken by the governing authority of Pike County shall be as valid and binding as if performed within the county. Such meetings may be called by the presiding officer or any two members of the governing body without regard to or compliance with time-consuming procedures and formalities otherwise required by law.
- (b) *Public works contracts*. Upon declaration of an emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the County may contract for public works without letting such contract out to the lowest, responsible bidder and without advertising and posting notification of such contract for four weeks; provided, however, that the emergency must be of such nature that immediate action is required and that the action is necessary for the protection of the public health, safety and welfare. Any public works contract entered into pursuant to this subsection shall be entered on the minutes of the County as soon as practical and the nature of the emergency described therein in accordance with O.C.G.A. § 36-91-22(e).
- (c) *Purchasing*. Upon declaration of an emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director

of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the purchasing ordinances, regulations or policies may be suspended. County officials shall continue to seek to obtain the best prices during the state of local emergency.

- (d) *Code enforcement*. Upon declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the County may temporarily suspend the enforcement of the ordinances of the County, or any portion thereof, where the emergency is of such nature that immediate action outside the code is required, such suspension is consistent with the protection of the public health, safety and welfare, and such suspension is not inconsistent with any federal or state statutes or regulations.
- (e) Fees. Upon declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the County may temporarily reduce or suspend any permit fees, application fees or other rate structures as necessary to encourage the rebuilding of the areas impacted by the disaster or emergency. The term "fees" include fees or rates charged by the county for building permits, land disturbance permits, zoning applications, special land use permits, temporary land use permits and other fees relating to the reconstruction, repair and clean up of areas impacted by the disaster or emergency. The term "fees" does not include fees collected by the county on behalf of the state or federal government or fees charged by the county pursuant to a state or federal statute or regulation.
- (f) *Temporary dwellings*. Upon the declaration of a state of emergency or disaster by the Governor or the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency, the County or its designee(s) may issue temporary mobile home, trailer, recreational vehicle or other temporary dwelling structures or parks in any zoning district, even though not otherwise permitted by development code, while the primary dwelling is being repaired. The temporary permit shall not exceed six months in duration. Upon expiration of the temporary permit and/or extension, the temporary dwelling must be removed.

#### Sec. 6. Overcharging prohibited.

To preserve, protect or sustain the life, health or safety of persons or property within a designated area upon the declaration of emergency or disaster, it shall be unlawful, during the duration of the emergency or subsequent recovery period, for any person, firm or corporation located or doing business in the city to overcharge for any goods, materials, foods, equipment, supplies, services, labor, motel rooms, temporary lodging or houses sold or rented within the county.

- (a) *Definitions*. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this section shall have the meanings ascribed, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
  - (1) "Overcharging" means charging prices for goods, materials, foods, equipment, supplies, services, labor, motel rooms, temporary lodging or houses, which exceed the customary charges by at least 25 percent or, in applicable cases, which exceed by at least 25 percent the suppliers' or providers' costs for such goods, materials, foods, equipment, supplies, services, labor, motel rooms, temporary lodging or houses. The existence of overcharging shall be presumed from a 25 percent or greater increase in the price at which the merchandise or rate, fee or cost/rental of housing was offered in the usual course of business immediately prior to the onset of the emergency or disaster, but shall not include increases in cost to the supplier directly attributable to the higher cost of material, supplies and labor costs resulting from the emergency.
  - (2) "Subsequent recovery period" means that period during which the emergency or disaster continues to cause disruptions in the area designated in the declaration of emergency, but shall not exceed three months after the declaration has been terminated, unless extended by action of the city governing authority.
- (b) *Effective date*. This section shall become effective only upon the signing of a declaration of emergency, stating that this section is in effect. Unless otherwise specified in the declaration of emergency or otherwise extended by the governing authority of the county, the provisions of this section shall remain in effect during the state of emergency and for a subsequent recovery period of three months.

#### Sec. 7. Registration of building and repair services.

- (a) In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 38-3-56, before building, constructing, repairing, renovating or making improvements to any real property, including dwellings, homes, buildings, structures or fixtures within an area in the county designated in a declared emergency or disaster, any person, firm, partnership, corporation or other entity must register with the Pike County Planning and Development Department and secure a building permit that is posted at the work site. Each day any such entity does business in the county without complying with this ordinance constitutes a separate offense.
- (b) The cost of registration fees in a declared emergency or disaster is fixed at \$50.00 per annum. Registration is nontransferable. The cost of the emergency building permit shall be equal to the cost for a building permit under existing regulations. The permit shall only be authorized for repairs.
- (c) When registering, any person, partnership, corporation or other entity making application must, under oath, complete an application, providing the following information:
  - (1) Name of applicant;
  - (2) Permanent address and phone number of applicant;

- (3) Applicant's Social Security number or federal Employer Identification number;
- (4) If applicant is a corporation, the state and date of incorporation;
- (5) Tag registration information for each vehicle to be used in the business;
- (6) List of cities and/or counties where the applicant has conducted business within the past 12 months;
- (7) Georgia sales tax number or authorization;
- (8) Georgia business license number, if required.
- (d) *Effective date*. This section shall become effective only upon the signing of a declaration of emergency, stating that this section is in effect. Unless otherwise specified in the declaration of emergency or otherwise extended by the county governing authority, the provisions of this Code section shall remain in effect during the state of emergency and for a subsequent recover period of three months.

#### Sec. 8. Closed or restricted areas and curfews during emergency.

- (a) To preserve, protect or sustain the life, health, welfare or safety of persons, or their property, within a designated area under a declaration of emergency, it shall be unlawful for any person to travel, loiter, wander or stroll in or upon the public streets, highways, roads, lanes, parks or other public grounds, public places, public buildings, places of amusement, eating places, vacant lots or any other place during a declared emergency between hours specified by the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency until the curfew is lifted.
- (b) To promote order, protect lives, minimize the potential for looting and other crimes, and facilitate recovery operations during an emergency, the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency shall have discretion to impose reentry restrictions on certain areas. Any discretionary restrictions shall be made in accordance with the local emergency operations plan, which shall be followed during emergencies.
- (c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to persons acting in the following capacities:
  - (1) Authorized and essential law enforcement personnel;
  - (2) Authorized and essential health care providers;
  - (3) Authorized and essential personnel of the county;
  - (4) Authorized National Guard or federal military personnel;
  - (5) Authorized and essential firefighters;
  - (6) Authorized and essential emergency response personnel;
  - (7) Authorized and essential personnel or volunteers working with or through an emergency management agency (EMA);
  - (8) Authorized and essential utility repair crews;

- (9) Citizens seeking to restore order to their homes or businesses while on their own property or place of business;
- (10) Other authorized and essential persons as designated on a list compiled by the County Manager of Pike County, and/or his/her designee(s) including but limited to the Chairman of the Board of Commissioners, the Sheriff of Pike County and/or the Director of the Pike County Emergency Management Agency.
- (d) *Enforceability*. This section shall be enforced by officers of the law enforcement personnel approved to provide aid and assistance during the emergency. Nothing contained in this section shall prohibit a law enforcement officer from bringing other charges under state law.
- (e) Effective date. This section shall become effective only upon the signing of a declaration of emergency, stating that this section is in effect. Unless otherwise specified in the declaration of emergency or otherwise extended by the county governing authority, the provisions of this Code section shall remain in effect during the state of emergency and for a subsequent recover period of three months.

# SECTION 156.160 CONDITIONS AND REGULATIONS FOR LIMITED LODGING AND VACATION HOMES APPROVED AS SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS

(A) General. Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals, as defined in this Chapter may be approved as special exceptions in residential and other zoning districts.



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(B) The following conditions, regulations, and rules shall apply to all approved special exceptions for Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals:

Vacation rentals, whether there is a primary owner in residence or not, shall not be permitted in accessory structures, non-habitable structures, nor temporary structures, such as recreational vehicles, tents, canopies, yurts, or similar structures.

- (1) Limited Lodging Vacation Rental facilities shall meet applicable International Building Code and International Fire Code regulations. For properties that are served by septic, Limited Lodging and Vacation Rental facilities shall meet applicable environmental health regulations.
- (2) Limited Lodging Vacation Rentals may have a maximum of four (4) guestrooms or sleeping rooms that meet the International Building Code regulations.
- (3) Maximum overnight occupancy for Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals shall be up to a maximum of two (2) persons per sleeping room or guestroom, plus two (2) additional persons per property, up to a maximum of ten (10) persons, excluding children under two (2) years of age. The property owner shall ensure that all contracts and online listings and advertisements clearly set forth the maximum number of overnight guests permitted at the property.
- (4) The maximum number of total guests and visitors allowed at any time in a single Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental shall not exceed the maximum overnight occupancy plus four (4) additional persons per property during the daytime, or fourteen (14) persons, whichever is less, excluding children under two (2) years of age.
- (5) Only approved facilities, meeting current standards shall be used as a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental. Only one (1) tenant shall be allowed on-site at any given time: Only one transient rental is allowed per parcel. Accessory dwellings shall not be used as a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental or occupied by the owner while the facilities approved for the special exception is being used as a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental unless specifically authorized by the Board of Commissioners when approving the special exception use.



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- (6) Parking shall be provided as follows:
  - a. Vehicles must be parked within the driveway, garage, or any other approved surface. No vehicles shall be parked on the State/County right-of-way or along any roadway at any time.
  - b. A minimum of two (2) on-site parking spaces shall be available for Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals. However, the owner of the property/facilities is responsible for providing sufficient parking to accommodate the guests. rooms;
  - c. Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals larger than as provided in this Section are prohibited.
  - d. This maximum number of vehicles permitted for guests shall be clearly set forth in all rental agreements and in all online advertisements and listings.
- (7) All activities associated with Limited Lodging and Vacation Rentals shall meet the general noise standards contained below. Quiet hours shall be from 10:00 p.m. to 8:00 a.m. The property owner shall ensure that the quiet hours and limits on outdoor activities are included in rental agreements and in all online advertisements and listings.
- (8) Outdoor amplified sound, other than household speakers, shall not be allowed at any time associated with a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental.
- (9) Pets, if allowed by owner, shall be secured on the property at all times. Continual nuisance barking by unattended pets is prohibited.
- (10) Recycling and refuse storage bins shall not be stored within public view unless in compliance with neighborhood standards. Recycling and trash receptacles shall be returned to screened storage areas within 24 hours of trash pick-up.
- (11) Outdoor fire areas, when not prohibited by state or local fire bans, may be allowed but shall be limited to 3 feet in diameter, shall be located on a non-combustible surface, shall be covered by a fire screen, and shall be extinguished as soon as it is no longer in use or by 10:00 p.m., whichever is earlier. No fire or fire area shall be located within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material.
- (12) All Limited Lodging or Vacation Rentals operating within the County must have a local certified property manager, which can be the owner or other designated agent, who is available 24 hours per days, 7 days per week during all times that the property is rented or used on a



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transient basis. Certified property managers may be professional property managers, realtors, property owners, or other designated person who is a minimum of twenty-one (21) years of age.

- (13) The owner of any Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental located behind a locked gate or within a gated community shall provide gate code or a lockbox with keys ("Knox Box" or similar) for exclusive use by local law enforcement and emergency services.
- (14) Once a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental is approved as a special exception, a copy of these regulations shall be posted within the facilities. The owner shall post these standards in a prominent place within six (6) feet of the front door of the facilities and include them as part of all rental agreements.
- (15) All online advertisements and/or listings for Limited Lodging or Vacation Rentals shall include the following:
  - a. Maximum occupancy, not including children under two (2);
  - b. Maximum number of vehicles;
  - c. Notification that quiet hours must be observed between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.;
  - d. Notification that no outdoor amplified sound other than household speakers is allowed; and,
  - e. The name, address, and number of the local certified property manager.
- (16) The owners shall pay all required County property taxes and fees.
- (17) The owner shall register the local certified property manager and update any contact changes with the Department of Planning & Development, which will make said contact information available to local law enforcement and emergency services.
- (18) The owner shall obtain a business license for said Limited Lodging and Vacation Rental and comply with all applicable provisions of this Code regarding occupational taxes.
- (19) The owners shall pay a hotel/motel occupancy tax for said Limited Lodging and Vacation Rental and comply with all applicable provisions of this Code.
- (20) The owner may be required to pay personal property taxes for said Limited Lodging and Vacation Rental.
- (21) Initial complaints on vacation rentals shall be directed to the local certified property manager identified in the business license or the County, as applicable. The certified property manager shall be available 24 hours during all times when the property is rented and



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shall be available by phone during these hours. Should a problem or arise and be reported to the certified property manager or the County, the property manager shall be responsible for contacting the tenant to correct the problem within 60 minutes, including visiting the site if necessary, to ensure that the issue has been corrected. Failure to respond to complaints or report them to emergency officials shall be considered a violation of this section and shall be cause for revocation of the business license and special land use permit. If the issue reoccurs, the complaint will be addressed by the Director or Code Enforcement division who may investigate to determine whether there was a violation of a zoning, licensing, or special use permit condition. At the discretion of the Director, the special exception may be scheduled for a revocation hearing with the Board of Commissioners, in compliance with all notice requirements. If the special exception is revoked, a special exception for a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental may not be reapplied for or issued for a period of at least one (1) year. Additionally, a license for a Limited Lodging or Vacation Rental shall not be issued for a period of at least one (1) year upon the property as a result of the revocation of the special exception.

**Staff Analysis:** The applicant is requesting a special exception to allow a short-term rental on the aforementioned property. The applicant is wanting to utilize the existing 8,910 square foot house for the short-term rental and has no plans of constructing any additional structures. The applicant will be required to meet all of the conditions of Section 156.160 of the Pike County Code listed above.

- (E) The Planning and Zoning Board will consider the following points in arriving at a recommendation on the special exception:
  - (1) It must not be contrary to the purposes of these regulations;

The request is not contrary to the purpose of the ordinance as it allows special exceptions to allow uses that are not listed as permitted uses.



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(2) It must not be detrimental to the use or development of adjacent properties or to the general neighborhood and it must not adversely affect the health, safety or welfare of the residents or workers;

Allowing this existing structure as a short-term rental should not be detrimental to the use or development of adjacent properties or to the general neighborhood and it must not adversely affect the health, safety or welfare of the residents or workers, as long as all conditions of the ordinance are met.

(3) It must not constitute a nuisance or hazard because of the number of persons who will attend or use such a facility, vehicular movement, noise or fumes generated or type of physical activity;

The proposed use of the property should not create a nuisance or a hazard to the surrounding properties if all conditions outlined in the code are met.

(4) It must not adversely affect existing uses and it must be proposed to be placed on a lot of sufficient size to satisfy the space requirements of the use;

The proposed use should not adversely affect any existing uses in the area if all conditions outlined in the code are met.

(5) It must meet all other requirements of these regulations;

All other requirements will be met.

(6) In addition, the Planning and Zoning Board shall also consider whether the applicant for the special exception at the time of submitting the application is in violation of the Zoning Code or any other provision of Code of Pike County, Georgia. If the applicant is determined to be in violation of the Zoning Code or any other provision of the Code of Pike County, Georgia, then the Board of Appeals shall further consider the circumstances related to such violation(s) as part of the criteria for considering the requested special exception.



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The property is currently in violation of the code as they are renting the subject property as a short-term rental without an approved special exception.

#### Recommendation:

Staff recommends <u>APPROVAL</u> of this special exception with the following condition:

1. All Conditions outlined in Section 156.160 of the Pike County Code shall be adhered to.

This request was heard by the Planning and Zoning Board on December 8, 2022, and the PZB recommended **DENIAL** of the request.

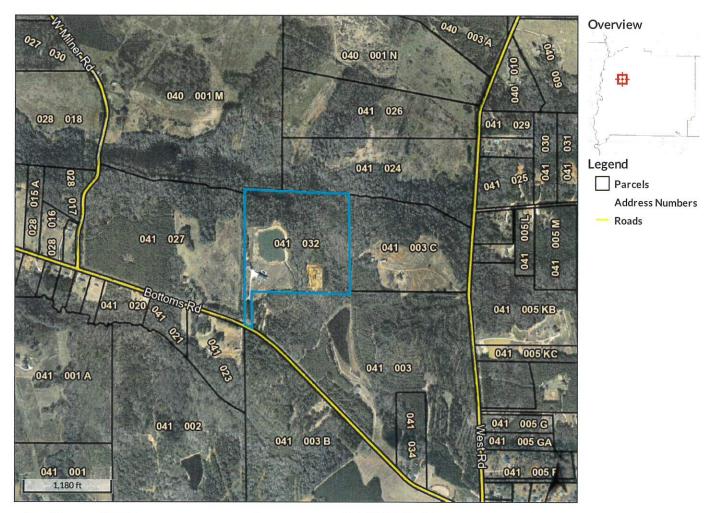

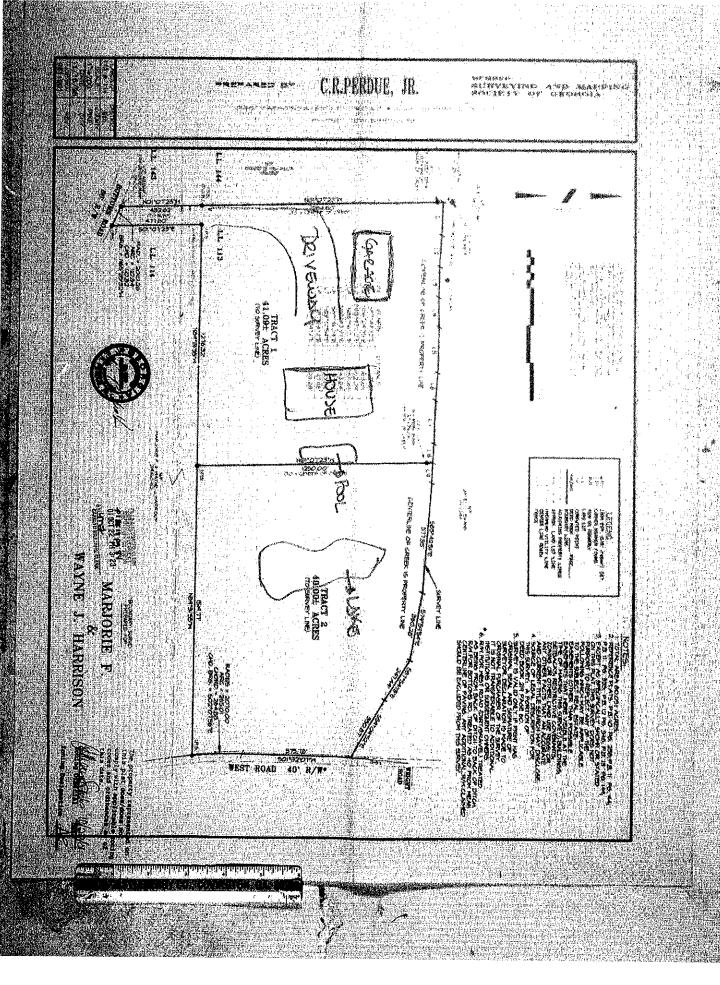

#### **Staff Analysis:**

The subject property is currently zoned A-R Agricultural Residential, and the applicant is wanting to zone the property R-20 Single-Family Residential- 2,000 Sq. Ft. for the development of a 37-lot residential subdivision. The subject property could be developed under the A-R zoning designation; however, the applicant is wanting to allow some flag lots that have flag polls that are longer than what is allowed under the A-R zoning. The applicant is also wanting to have



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an increased minimum house size than what is allowed under the A-R zoning. By rezoning the property to R-20 will also not allow any livestock or agricultural land uses.

- (F) The Planning and Zoning Board will consider the following points in arriving at a decision on a zoning amendment:
  - (1) It must not be contrary to the purpose of this chapter;

The intent of CH 156 is to create zoning classifications that will be compatible bordering one another. The following is the purpose of the R-20 Zoning District as described in Section 156.60 of the Pike County Code:

R-20 Zoning Districts are intended to establish and preserve quiet, relatively low to medium density neighborhoods of single-family residences as desired by large numbers of people with a required minimum dwelling area of 2,000 square feet. These districts are free from other uses which are incompatible with single-family homes.

This proposal of R-20 zoning would not be contrary to the purpose of this chapter as the applicant is proposing a low density neighborhood.

(2) It must not be detrimental to the use or development of adjacent properties or to the general neighborhood and it must not adversely affect the health or safety of residents or workers;

The proposed zoning of the property of R-20 would not be detrimental to the use or development of adjacent properties or to the general neighborhood as the area is all residential land uses.

(3) It must not constitute a nuisance or a hazard because of the number of persons who will attend or use such a facility, vehicular movement, noise or fumes generated or type of physical activity;

The proposed use of the property will not create a nuisance or a hazard to the surrounding properties.

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#### (4) It must not adversely affect existing uses;

The proposed zoning of the property should not adversely affect the existing uses of adjacent properties.

(5) In addition, the Planning and Zoning Board shall also consider whether the applicant for the amendment at the time of submitting the application is in violation of the Zoning Code or any other provision of the Code of Pike County, Georgia. If the applicant is determined to be in violation of the Zoning Code or any other provisions of the Code of Pike County, Georgia, then the Planning Commission shall further consider the circumstances related to such violation(s) as part of the criteria for considering the requested amendment.

The property is currently not in violation of the code.

Recommendation: Staff recommends <u>APPROVAL</u> of the request to rezone with the following conditions:

- 1. Preliminary Plat approval shall be approved prior to any development of the subject property.
- 2. A full set of development plans shall be submitted and approved prior to any construction on the subject property.
- 3. All roads for the development shall be constructed in accordance with Section 155.27 of the Pike County Subdivision Code.
- 4. All structures must be constructed of brick, stone, stucco, or cement fiber board or any combination thereof. No vinyl siding shall be allowed, except in the eyes and soffits.
