## **Spoke at Public Hearing:**

Commissioner Jason Proctor stated he agrees with the citizens regarding a tax increase, he does not want to see one either. Proctor mentioned fuel costs have increased with inflation and the ambulance service cost for the county has doubled. Commissioner Proctor requested the County Mananger and Department Heads to look back over the budget and see if there is a way to cut some things in the budget. Commissioner Guy agrees with Commissioner Proctor, inflation has gone out of the roof. Commissioner Guy asked the County Mananger to explain one reason for the increase. Commissioner Daniel reminded the public that this is just the county portion of the tax bill, not the entire tax bill. County Manager Brandon Rogers stated all the services in the county have increased with fuel costs being the main cause. Employees are hard to retain because there are so many positions available in the workforce, therefore the county did a cost-of-living adjustment for the employees this year. Every line item in the budget is affected by the inflation the economy is suffering from. CM Rogers stated new housing in the county is more of a burden on the tax base than people realize. For additional housing, it is figured 2-4 people per household, that puts more people on the roads, more in the school system and more people calling emergency services. The services the county has to offer are taxed every time another house is added to the county. The county does not have a heavy commercial tax base. CM Rogers stated around 90% of the tax base comes from residential and 10% from commercial. Commissioner Jenkins noted he has been sitting on the Board for ten years and has not yet voted for a tax increase and he is not going to start now. Commissioner Daniel thanked everyone for attending the Public Hearing.
